#### **HOPE ACADEMY PA**



# St Peter's chosen for research project

St Peter's has been selected to be a part of an ELCA churchwide research into finding ways to engage children, youth, and family ministry. Alex and Pr Molly are spending a week of training in New Orleans January 15-21. During this time of learning and sharing our ministries with the 10 congregations from across the US, we will develop a plan for St Peter's and our TOGETHER ministries and how we can listen to youth in our community and discover ways to encourage and engage faith formation. Our St Peter's/TOGETHER team is led by Alex and the members are Bennett Williams, Stephanie Ponnett, Tiara Taylor (young adult), Jen Joyce Kemper, Pr Molly and Ambriana Guzman (youth). We meet monthly with our Co-Op coach, Andrea Fluegel. At the end of the two years, we hope to share what we have learned with churches within our synod. The information will be used in a churchwide resource guide. Here is more about the Formation Co-Op:

THE FORMATION CO-OP roots young people in a lifelong and transformative faith in Jesus that is experienced through life-giving communities. We do this through an everexpanding community of co-learners and cocreators made up of Guides who model and teach deep listening practices to congregation teams, and Congregation Teams themselves, who use these skills to listen to and learn from their context and that of others. Through this listening and learning process, Congregation Teams will identify and articulate new ways of doing youth ministry suited to their context and relevant to 21<sup>st</sup> century needs. In partnership with their assigned Guide - and strengthened through intentional training - Congregation Teams will draw from their 1) stories about youth ministry; 2) current realities facing youth and congregations; 3) congregational assets; and 4) congregational partnerships in order to develop a ministry plan from which they will experiment, learn, and share with the wider community over the course of two years. 
